**sard** ( särd) *n.* **1.** A clear or translucent, deep orange-red to brownish-red variety of chalcedony. Also Called **sardius** . [Middle English *sarde* from Old French from Latin *sarda* perhaps from *Sard<sup>o</sup>s* Sardis, an ancient city of western Asia Minor]

**to·paz** ( t<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>“p<sup>2</sup>z”) *n.* **1. a.** A colorless, blue, yellow, brown, or pink aluminum silicate mineral, often found in association with granitic rocks and valued as a gemstone, especially in the brown and pink varieties. **b.** Any of various yellow gemstones, especially a yellow variety of sapphire or corundum. **2.** A light yellow variety of quartz.

**di·a·mond** ( d<sup>o</sup>“...-m...nd, d<sup>o</sup>“m...nd) *n.* **1.** An extremely hard, highly refractive crystalline form of carbon that is usually colorless and is used as a gemstone and in abrasives, cutting tools, and other applications. **2.** A figure with four equal sides forming two inner obtuse angles and two inner acute angles; a rhombus or lozenge.
